Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

Highlights are from the meeting of the Board of Directors, Wednesday, June 15, 2011. A complete set of minutes, once approved by the Board is available at the District Office.

Attendance: All directors were in attendance.

Consent Agenda: Items reviewed and unanimously approved.

Old Business: None.

New Business: Adoption of Resolution 2011-03—Establish a CalPERS 457 Deferred Annuity Plan—Sponsoring this plan will enable employees to make contributions to a supplemental retirement plan if they should choose to do so. This plan was outlined in the previous Personnel Agreement, but was not established. There is no expense for the district. A motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved to adopt Resolution 2011-03.

Ordinance 2011-04—Surplus Property Disposal Policy—A motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved to adopt Ordinance 2011-04.

Staff Report: Staff is engaged in ongoing talks with the developers of Cottonwood Estates to insure all future expenses that could possibly be incurred are covered by the developer.

The attorney is waiting for a motion of summary judgment to be filed by the DOJ attorney. Until this is reviewed by the attorney, we will not know exactly what the Bureau is asking the judge to throw out.

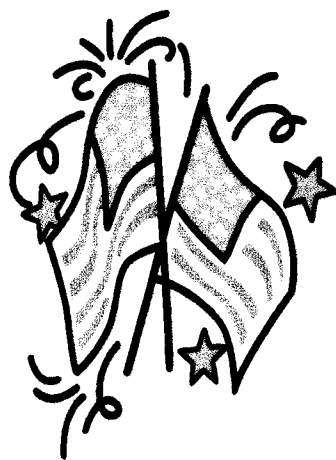
Staff has completed the extensive task of updating manuals for Shasta County Environmental Health.

Notary Service

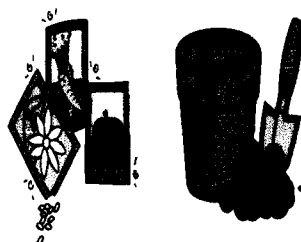

*******Water Conservation*******

"Water Conservation for Kids: Seven Simple Steps"

- Explain to kids why clean water is important. Tell them that they need it to drink, cook, bathe and water plants.
- Let them know that running the water while brushing their teeth, washing fruit and vegetables and when playing water games outside wastes fresh water.
- Check into ideas for water conservation and how kids can recycle water. Make a chart demonstrating different ideas for water conservation.
- Catch rainwater in a bucket and let kids use it for watering plants inside and outside.
- Teach kids that flushing the toilet all the time consumes gallons of water. Have them practice flushing the toilet only when necessary.
- Let kids do tasks around the house that help teach water conservation. Some examples of chores that teach are: run the dishwasher or washing machine only when full; turn the hose off when washing pets and cars; fill the sink with water when washing dishes and water the lawn in the early morning or evening hours and not during the middle of the day.
- Designate a water conservation paper where kids must explain two or three things that would happen if the earth runs out of fresh water. Younger kids can do this assignment with drawings and short sentences.
